According to the U.S. Department of Edcuation:

Black students are less likely to recieved merit-based scholarships.

Whites were slightly more likely than Blacks to receive need-based awards from the institutions they attended.

According to the National Student Clearnighouse Research Center:

Black student retrention and persistence is lower than counterparts at 4-year, 2-year and nonprofit educational institutions.
